ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Plumbing Design (100%)

- Perform study and design for projects that may include existing facility evaluations, feasibility studies, design, cost estimating, and similar functions.
- Field survey to identify site conditions.
- Code review and compliance.
- Plumbing calculations including water supply, storm, and equipment sizes.
- Design plumbing systems including sanitary waste, vent, storm, domestic water distribution systems, compressed air systems, and natural gas or propane systems.
- Selects, schedules, and sizes basic plumbing system components including plumbing fixtures and equipment.
- Coordination with design work of other disciplines.
- Produce plumbing plans, schedules, details, and diagrams.
- Review of shop drawings and product submittals.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Must be authorized to work in the U.S.
- 0-2 years of experience in commercial plumbing design.
- ASPE CPDT or CPD credential is desirable.
- High School degree or equivalent required; Associate degree in AutoCAD, Revit, mechanical design, science, energy analysis, or other technical-degree desirable.
- AutoCAD proficiency required as it applies to the preparation of plumbing drawings. Revit proficiency desirable.
- Ability to lay out plumbing systems and calculate flows and pressure drops for domestic water, sanitary waste, sanitary vent, and storm water systems, and size plumbing equipment such as water heaters and circulation pumps.
- Possess a comprehensive understanding of plumbing systems.
- Familiar with construction document organization and preparation.
- A demonstrated ability to prioritize and handle multiple tasks.
- Attention to detail and a high level of accuracy while preparing documentation.
- Excellent interpersonal skills.
- Effective organizational and written skills.
- Must be a self-starter.
- Computer skills include the MS Office suite, Adobe Acrobat and/or Bluebeam Revu, and SharePoint.

WORK CONDITIONS

Physical Demands
